The teaching for this week continues with the sermon series "God's and His People" started at Zion Lutheran on January 26th. This week we consider the narrative of the tower of Babel as recorded in Genesis 11. Next week the topic will be the call of Abraham in Genesis 12.

Invocation and Opening Verses

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us.

But if we confess our sins, God, who is faithful and just, will forgive our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

Scripture Reading Genesis 11:1-9 ESV

1 Now the whole earth had one language and the same words. 2 And as people migrated from the east, they found a plain in the land of Shinar and settled there. 3 And they said to one another, "Come, let us make bricks, and burn them thoroughly." And they had brick for stone, and bitumen for mortar. 4 Then they said, "Come, let us build ourselves a city and a tower with its top in the heavens, and let us make a name for ourselves, lest we be dispersed over the face of the whole earth." 5 And the Lord came down to see the city and the tower, which the children of man had built. 6 And the Lord said, "Behold, they are one people, and they have all one

language, and this is only the beginning of what they will do. And nothing that they propose to do will now be impossible for them. 7 Come, let us go down and there confuse their language, so that they may not understand one another's speech." 8 So the Lord dispersed them from there over the face of all the earth, and they left off building the city. 9 Therefore its name was called Babel, because there the Lord confused the language of all the earth. And from there the Lord dispersed them over the face of all the earth.

Scripture Reading Acts 2:42-47

42 And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. 43 And awe came upon every soul, and many wonders and signs were being done through the apostles. 44 And all who believed were together and had all things in common. 45 And they were selling their possessions and belongings and distributing the proceeds to all, as any had need. 46 And day by day, attending the temple together and breaking bread in their homes, they received their food with glad and generous hearts, 47 praising God and having favor with all the people. And the Lord added to their number day by day those who were being saved.

Apostles' Creed

Teaching Genesis 8:20-9:2 (*We consider connections between the Flood and Tower of Babel narratives today, so a few verses from the Flood narrative are included for the teaching.*)

8:20 Then Noah built an altar to the Lord and took some of every clean animal and some of every clean bird and offered burnt offerings on the altar. 21 And when the Lord smelled the pleasing aroma, the Lord said in his heart, "I will never again curse the ground because of man, for the intention of man's heart is evil from his youth. Neither will I ever again strike down every living creature as I have done. 22 While the earth remains, seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night, shall not cease." 9:1 And God blessed Noah and his sons and said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth. 2 The fear of you and the dread of you shall be upon every beast of the earth and upon every bird of the heavens, upon everything that creeps on the ground and all the fish of the sea. Into your hand they are delivered.

11:4 Then they said, “Come, let us build ourselves a city and a tower with its top in the heavens, and let us make a name for ourselves, lest we be dispersed over the face of the whole earth.” 5 And the Lord came down to see the city and the tower, which the children of man had built. 6 And the Lord said, “Behold, they are one people, and they have all one language, and this is only the beginning of what they will do. And nothing that they propose to do will now be impossible for them. 7 Come, let us go down and there confuse their language, so that they may not understand one another's speech.”

Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of our hearts be acceptable in your sight, O Lord, our Rock and our Redeemer.

Even after the Lord God had sent the great flood, sin and evil had not stopped among people. Yet God still made promises and blessings for all people through the blessings on Noah. Even though God knew “the intention of man’s heart is evil from his youth,” God blessed Noah, his sons and all future descendants:

1. Never again would God send a great flood.
2. Seasons of the earth enabling farming would continue for all time.
3. All animals would be afraid of mankind.
4. Animals were also now given as food, as well as plants.
5. God said mankind was to multiply and fill the whole earth.

Thus, the Lord God promised He would bless, protect, give food and give places to live for all mankind. It is very clear God wanted to continue to watch over and be near all mankind in these promises.

A relationship of faith, trusting in the Lord God, is the central issue in all the Bible. Even though all people have evil intentions in their hearts, God wants to take care of people and He wants people to trust Him. God had made a promise and plan to deal with human evil once and for all. Adam and Eve heard His words: “I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and her offspring; he shall bruise your head, and you shall bruise his heel.” (Genesis 3:15) All mankind need their Creator God and His grace and love.

The people who built the tower of Babel proposed to rely on their own power and ingenuity for their survival and welfare. They did not recognize the Creator God’s blessings and protection. They would not go out and fill the earth as God directed. They wanted their own name to be great without acknowledging God’s blessings.

The Creator God has built into all mankind a tremendous creativity and ingenuity. People study creation. People learn and work with everything in creation to build and make many things. Working with things of this world to enrich our lives are blessings of God which He provides. But evil intention comes in when people believe they can control creation, as if they have made all things. When people want to make their own name great and believe they survive like that, not only is this a denial of God and His blessings, it is a denial of the reality of human life.

God caused different languages to be spoken and understood by the people building the tower, and they could no longer work together as one. They separated out into language groups and started filling the earth as God had said they should.

Throughout time, cultures and languages a knowledge of the Creator God has been among all people. St. Paul used this natural knowledge of God to teach about God's Son, Jesus Christ.

22 So Paul, standing in the midst of the Areopagus, said: "Men of Athens, I perceive that in every way you are very religious. 23 For as I passed along and observed the objects of your worship, I found also an altar with this inscription: To the unknown god." What therefore you worship as unknown, this I proclaim to you. 24 The God who made the world and everything in it, being Lord of heaven and earth, does not live in temples made by man, 25 nor is he served by human hands, as though he needed anything, since he himself gives to all mankind life and breath and everything. 26 And he made from one man every nation of mankind to live on all the face of the earth, having determined allotted periods and the boundaries of their dwelling place, 27 that they should seek God, and perhaps feel their way toward him and find him. Yet he is actually not far from each one of us, 28 for

'In him we live and move and have our being'; as even some of your own poets have said, 'For we are indeed his offspring.'

29 Being then God's offspring, we ought not to think that the divine being is like gold or silver or stone, an image formed by the art and imagination of man. 30 The times of ignorance God overlooked, but now he commands all people everywhere to repent, 31 because he has fixed a day on which he will judge the world in righteousness by a man whom he has appointed; and of this he has given assurance to all by raising him from the dead." (Acts 17)

What happens when faith in Jesus comes to people so that people know God is watching over them; that God has forgiven them of all evil intentions and actions; and that God gives them not only all things for this life but even for life everlasting?

What happens is shown among the first Christians after the coming of the Holy Spirit in Acts chapter 2:

42 And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. 43 And awe came upon every soul, and many wonders and signs were being done through the apostles. 44 And all who believed were together and had all things in common. 45 And they were selling their possessions and belongings and distributing the proceeds to all, as any had need. 46 And day by day, attending the temple together and breaking bread in their homes, they received their food with glad and generous hearts, 47 praising God

and having favor with all the people. And the Lord added to their number day by day those who were being saved.

God in His mercy and grace does not want to destroy men, women and children even though we have evil intentions in us even since our conception. (Psalm 51:5) God wants to cleanse people of evil and give true life and love through Jesus Christ. This forgiveness and true life He offers to all people no matter what language, culture, tribe and condition.

Please pray with me: Dear Lord Jesus, Help me trust in Your promises to forgive and give me life. Let me not be like the people of Babel who wanted to forget God and make their own name great. Give me faith to trust that all things are in Your hands, and that as You love me I can also share love. Amen.

Now may the peace of God that passes all understanding guard our hearts and minds in Christ Jesus, our Lord. Amen.
