PSALMS – God's Songs for Us Lent and Holy Week 2022

Psalm 31:5, 9-16 ("To the choirmaster. A Psalm of David.")

Psalm 31:1-2 starts:

1 In you, O LORD, do I take refuge; let me never be put to shame; in your righteousness deliver me! 2 Incline your ear to me; rescue me speedily! Be a rock of refuge for me, a strong fortress to save me!

In this Psalm King David looks to the LORD God as his refuge, even though many people are against him. He trusts in the LORD even though his situation does look not secure.

As in many Psalms, numerous thoughts of Psalm 31 foreshadow the life, ministry, suffering, death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus. Jesus lived the perfect life in harmony with God the Father. The devil, human antagonists like the Pharisees and Sadducees, the weak faith of His own disciples and the whole of humanity's sin went against Jesus. But Jesus was the perfect Son, perfect Servant and perfect Righteous One which endured all troubles in harmony with His Father. No Old Testament sinful psalmist could ever be perfectly serving, obedient and righteous, but they might foreshadow - or point to - Jesus. King David had righteousness before the LORD through faith in God's promises, but Jesus Christ was fully righteous in Himself and also had a perfect relationship with God.

Some of the words of Psalm 31 which we consider today perfectly foreshadowed and foretold the Messiah's person and work and Jesus used them on the cross. The last thing Jesus said on the cross He quoted from part of Psalm 31:5...

Into your hand I commit my spirit; you have redeemed me, O LORD, faithful God.

Luke 23: 46 Then Jesus, calling out with a loud voice, said, "Father, into your hands I commit my spirit!" And having said this he breathed his last.
