- III. "Out of his heart will flow rivers of living water. Now this he said about the Spirit, whom those who believed in him were about to receive..."
 - The promise from Jesus (as the Scripture has said) is that His people's lives will flow with the Holy Spirit.
 - What does that look like? There are gifts from the Holy Spirit, but not everyone has the same gift. (1 Corinthians 12)
 - However, in all of Jesus' people the Holy Spirit produces fruit:

Matthew 5:22-25 But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law. And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. If we live by the Spirit, let us also keep in step with the Spirit.

IV. Holy Spirit is given only by the fact that Jesus is glorified.

("for as yet the Spirit had not been given, because Jesus was not yet glorified.")

- Holy Spirit comes because of what Jesus has done and does.
- Holy Spirit points Jesus' followers to look to , not themselves.
- It is the Father, in the name of Jesus, who is charge of sending the Holy Spirit.

John 14:26 But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, he will teach you all things and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you.
