Sermon Notes (Nov 5) - "Protected By God on the Way to His House"

Revelation1:9 I, John, your brother and partner in the tribulation and the kingdom and the patient endurance that are in Jesus, was on the island called Patmos on account of the word of God and the testimony of Jesus. 10 I was in the Spirit on the Lord's day, and I heard behind me a loud voice like a trumpet 11 saying, "Write what you see in a book and send it to the seven churches, to Ephesus and to Smyrna and to Pergamum and to Thyatira and to Sardis and to Philadelphia and to Laodicea."...

...17 When I saw him, I fell at his feet as though dead. But he laid his right hand on me, saying, "Fear not, I am the first and the last, 18 and the living one. I died, and behold I am alive forevermore, and I have the keys of Death and Hades. 19 Write therefore the things that you have seen, those that are and those that are to take place after this.

- Jesus had John write the visions to seven churches (and even to the whole world 10:8-11).

## C. Protection on Earth to Get to Heaven

7:1 – The angels holding back destruction of the earth, seas and plants until God seals His people

7:2 – "Do not harm the earth or the sea or the trees, until we have sealed the servants of our God on their foreheads." (144,000 represents the complete number of God's people)

- God hold back the final judgment upon evil until all His people are sealed as HIS.
- God's people endure through all tribulations, even through the great last tribulation.
- 7:9-17 God's people serve Him with out evil, death, sufferings or sorrow.
- God is in control of all things that His people might get through this life to be with Him.

Dr. Louis Brighton – Concordia Commentary on Revelation: (Italics are from Dr. Brighton)

God's Spirit, then, does use signs, visible marks or actions, in the sealing of God's people. Even as Jesus' ministry was accompanied by "signs" ( $\sigma\eta\mu\epsilon\tilde{i}\alpha$ , Acts 2:22), so also the ministry of the apostles was accompanied by "sign(s)" ( $\sigma\eta\mu\epsilon\tilde{i}\alpha$ , Acts 2:22), so also the ministry of the apostles was accompanied by "sign(s)" ( $\sigma\eta\mu\epsilon\tilde{i}\alpha$ ,  $\sigma\eta\mu\epsilon\tilde{i}\alpha^{1f}$ )—perceptible activities of the Spirit—which confirmed that their ministry of preaching the Gospel (Acts 2:14–35), baptizing (Acts 2:38, 41), and the breaking of the bread (Acts 2:42) was of God. The Sacraments of Baptism and the Lord's Supper are visible signs, that is, tangible elements (water, bread and wine) accompanied by words of God promising the forgiveness of sins (Mt 26:28; Acts 2:38). Through these signs, Baptism and the Lord's Supper, the Spirit works according to those words and promises of God, and the Spirit thereby seals God's people and confirms that they are indeed his people. Thus the Spirit of God, in his gracious activity through God's Word and the Sacraments of Baptism and the Lord's Supper, seals God's people so that they know they belong to God and that he will protect them in their faith in the midst of all the tribulations they endure.

One other place in Revelation mentions this sealing on the foreheads of God's people on earth. In Rev 9:1–6, in the second vision of events on earth, in the fifth scene (the fifth trumpet-angel) of the vision, John sees scorpion-like demons from the abyss (hell) afflicting the human race. But the command was given to these demons that they should afflict only those who did not have the seal of God on their foreheads. *Whatever these demon-like afflictions were to be, God's own people were defended and kept safe from them, because they bore the seal of God on their foreheads.*<sup>2</sup>
